### **ANNOINTING OF THE SICK:**

The Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Church. Before Vatican II, it was called Extreme Unction or The Sacrament of the Dying. It is now viewed not as a sacrament just for the dying but for anyone who is experiencing physical or emotional infirmity

due to sickness and/or old age. While it is a prayer for healing, it is most especially a prayer that God will bless the individual with the grace and strength to cope with the infirmity as a transition to full life. We prayer with and for all those who will be anointed today.
