FOOD PANTRY:

The decision has been made to have a Food Pantry at Malia totally supported by the Malia parishioners. It will occur on the last two Wednesdays of every month and the food distribution will be limited to residents of Keaukaha and parishioners of Malia. This means that the Malia Food Pantry will be dependent on food brought by the parishioners. We are again encouraged to ask friends and colleagues to bring a can of food to social, family, business, and neighborhood events. There will be an updated list of foods needed available at the entrance to the church. Feel free to take a list home. Let's make this very effective local effort at feeding the hungry a mission of Malia. Mahalo.

PARISH FEAST DAY:

The Liturgy Committee decided last year that we would celebrate the Sunday the closest to the Feast of the Assumption of Mary (Aug 15th) as our Feast Day. Hence, on Sunday, Aug 14th (next Sunday) we will celebrate our feast at the 9:00AM Mass. There will be a procession and crowning of Mary in the courtyard following the Mass. After the Mass we will have a little festival with face painting and a water slide for the kids (bring a towel and a swim suit). There will also be a pot luck so please bring a dish to share.

CHANGES IN THE LITURGY:

We are aware that there will be some changes in the liturgical texts of the Mass. As previously stated, these changes were made by people much smarter and more important than any of us! The goal is to make the English a more literal translation from the Latin and make it more scriptural. It will seem clumsy at first but we will get used to it. The new translations will be used in all the English speaking countries around the world. Bishop Larry Silva has given permission to start using the new translations on the first Sunday of September. This happens to be the first Sunday that Fr. Wilson becomes Pastor/Administrator of Malia. The changes you will experience are NOT because of Fr. Wilson! They will be happening in all the Catholic Churches in the United States. He has made it very clear to the Transition Team that things will stay as they are.

PARISH COUNCIL NOMINEES:

The nominees for the Malia Pastoral Council are due next Sunday. You can nominate yourself or some other registered parishioner of Malia. Nomination forms are available at the entrance to the church.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:

Registration for Religious Education will begin next Sunday, Aug 14 after the 9:00AM Mass. All youth, grade 1—12 are encouraged to register. The Sacramental program (First Communion, First Reconciliation and Confirmation) is integrated into the Religious Education program. The classes will be on Sunday from 10:30AM—11:30. Learning about Jesus Christ, the Bible, and the Church is a very strong foundation for all young people. Parents are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity and this program. There is no cost involved. The parish financially supports this program.

USE OF THE PARISH FACILITIES:

We have wonderful renovated facilities for use by the parishioners and community, family, and not-for-profit groups. Parishioners (those who attend church regularly and are regular contributors) may use the facilities free of charge for one time events. (Insurance coverage is needed). There is a set fee for all other groups. This fee can be lowered by the pastor for specific reasons. The areas available are: the kitchen (hopefully by Sept 1), the hall, the preschool area in the back, and the religious education area on the side. These can be rented for a one time event or weekly, monthly, or annually. Please help spread the word regarding the availability of these facilities. In order to protect our not-for-profit status, we do not rent to for-profit groups. Rental inquiries can be made by calling the parish office. Laverne Costa will work with Fr. Wilson in working out the details of rentals.

COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE:

There will be a Communal Penance Service on Saturday, Aug 13 at 8:30AM. During the service there will be an opportunity for individual confession and absolution.

FAREWELL/WELCOME CELEBRATION:

We will say “A Hui Ho” to Fr. Joe and “E Komo Mai” to Fr. Wilson on Aug. 28th. There will be a concelebrated Mass in the church hall at 9:00AM with a pot-luck Social to follow. Mike Tallett is coordinating the social and will give further information as the day gets closer. The regular 5:15PM and 7:00PM (Spanish) Mass will be celebrated in the church on Saturday, Aug 27th.

FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATION RE-ENTRY SUMMIT:

There is a Summit on Aug 16 at Sangha Hall, Hilo addressing the challenges former offenders face upon reintegration. It is an inter-faith effort. Speakers include Mayor Billy Kenoi, Carol Ignacio, Chaplain Bonnie Holcombe among others. There are fliers at the entrance to the church for registration and further information.
