*"Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant:
..for the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve..."*

These words from the Gospel for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time are very appropriate for the beginning of our celebration at Malia Puka O Kalani this weekend of the canonization of St. Marianne Cope of Moloakai. In following her vocation call from Christ and responding to the invitation of the Hawaiian leadership, Mother Marianne came to Hawaii *not to be served, but to serve.*

The Gospel passage that the Church has chosen to be used for all the special celebrations of St. Marianne Cope, is the well known Gospel passage from Matthew:25:37-41 "*Lord when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?" And the King will say to them in reply, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me...but Amen, I say to you, what you did not to for one of these least ones, you did not do for me."*

This week we all are called to reflect on how St. Marianne's Cope's response to the Gospel is a direct call to us to follow in her footsteps of Witnessing to Jesus. Hopefully by the time we all gather together on October 27th to venerate her relic and honor her visit to Malia Puka O Kalani, each one of us will have committed ourselves in some way to compassionate service in her memory. This will be the best way for all of us to truly try to follow in her footsteps.

That commitment can and will take many forms, some clear examples include offering to visit those in hospitals and nursing homes (this is clearly part of the compassionate legacy that St. Marianne left us as lived out by the Sisters of St. Francis throughout Hawaii). Mother Marianne also was a strong advocate for quality housing, which she struggled for on Kalaupapa and elsewhere. We will have the opportunity to do likewise in joining with others to renovate public housing on November 17th. Please let us know of other opportunities so we can share them as a family together, an '*Ohana* here at Mala Puka O Kalani. We ask for this grace *to serve rather than be served*-to put our faith into action. We give thanks for the nourishment of our faith in the Eucharist we share as we journey together trying to follow in the footsteps of St. Marianne Cope!
