My dear Ohana,

I want to thank God for allowing me to return anew to my dear Malia Ohana, after medical checkups in Medellín and strengthening the family bonds with my brothers, sisters, nephews and nieces.

I thank father Robert Stark for having shared these last few weekends with our community and I give infinite thanks to my Malia community for its prayers, good wishes, friendship and love. I want to tell you that I missed you a lot and that I had the opportunity to talk to about you, in length, to my family and that they are grateful because you have received me as another brother in our Hawaiian family.

After the medical checkups the conclusions are:

The tumor in the liver remains stable, it has not shown any change, we just need to keep monitoring it. In the colon I have diverticulosis and significant inflammation, and the recommendation is to be on a strict diet, manage my stress and exercise more, as I have elevated blood pressure, triglycerides and cholesterol.

I have to be particularly careful, due to my family history: my brother and aunt have died of colon cancer, and three of my sisters are suffering from colon ailments too. I await the results from an x-ray of the lower spine, to find out what is causing me constant back pain.

However, the most important conclusion that the doctors and I arrived to is that I am getting old!
