PASTORAL PLAN: BUILDING MAINTENANCE

We continue with the summary of the 2013-14 Pastoral Plan. The entire Plan can be viewed by going to the parish website: www.maliapukaokalani.com

In 2008, the bishop asked each parish to establish a list of three top priorities which would be the focus of the parish for the next five years. Two of the priorities established by Malia parishioners were YOUTH and LAY LEADERSHIP. We talked about these in previous bulletins in our summary of the Pastoral Plan. The third priority was BUILDING REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE. Much has been done the past five years; it is difficult to remember the former condition of our facilities. Over the past five years we have done the following:

1. Repainted and renovated the church
2. Replaced the roof on the church and the old parking garage
3. Repaired the cracked foundations; replaced lighting with energy efficient
4. Replaced the gutters and downspouts in the hall and the school
5. Repaired the school floor and the school bathroom floor
6. Repaired the leaking roof in the Religious Education Room
7. Renovated and put partitions and new carpeting in the R.E. Room
8. Renovated and brought the kitchen to certification level
9. Replaced a bathroom and repaired a leak in the rectory
10. Replaced the upper screens in the hall
11. Painted the hall and installed fans
12. Built and installed a bathroom in the hall for wheelchairs
13. Replaced the sound system in the church

The parishioners need to remember the history and acknowledge yourselves for funding these necessary repairs and renovations. We also need to acknowledge our dedicated and hard working Building Maintenance Committee. Much of the work was voluntarily done by them. Our facilities, which were in the state of disrepair five years ago, are again safe, attractive, and no longer deteriorating. This was all accomplished because of planning. The Maintenance Committee has a Five Year Plan which is annually updated. 2013-2014 is Year 4 of a plan that now extends to 2017. The Plan for this year (2013-14) includes:

1. Rekey the entire facility so that there is access control
2. Replace the four exit doors in the hall with code compliant fire door
3. Repaint the church pews
4. Zone the electrical meter boxes for cost control (over)

There was a subcommittee of the Building Maintenance Committee established to look into the conditions set by the Hawaiian Homelands for the use of our facilities. The preliminary conclusion is that the mission of Malia and the standards set by the Hawaiian Homelands are complimentary. Going forward the following standards for the use of the Malia facilities will be in place:

1. All the facilities can be used at any time for events and meeting of the parish and the diocese at no cost.
2. All other groups requesting to use our facilities must be local family and/or not-for-profit groups that have a purpose/mission in accord with the purpose/mission of Malia and/or the Diocese of Honolulu.
3. All groups utilizing our facilities must serve people from Keaukaha and/or people of native Hawaiian origin. At least 50% of the families and/or groups being served or using the facilities are required to meet this standard. Hence, our facilities are not available for use by all families and/or not-for-profit groups.
4. There will be no lease or contractual relationship between Malia and any group. Hence, the Malia facilities are not “for rent”.
5. There will be a “Letter of Agreement” between Malia and the family/group using the facilities. This “Letter of Agreement” will detail the conditions, restrictions, and limitations of use.
6. Any family/group using any of the facilities must have proof of insurance or purchase event insurance through the diocese.
7. The Malia facilities available for use are: the school, the hall, the kitchen, and the patio.
8. The arrangement to use the facilities can be a one time event or on-going.
9. The family/group using the facilities will be asked to pay the expenses (utilities, supplies, wear-and-tear, personnel) and make a donation to Malia in accord with their ability. They will be also asked for a deposit which will be returned if the facilities (including bathrooms) are left as they found them.

These standards meet the standards of the Hawaiian Homelands who own the land. They also meet the standards of the mission of Malia. We will develop a flyer which will announce the availability of our facilities to people from Keaukaha and/or native Hawaiians for family gatherings, educational and social programs, support groups, etc. Please tell your friends and neighbors about this.
