The Pastoral Council of Malia completed the Malia "Road-Map" for the year July 1, 2013—June 30, 2014. The entire document can be read and copied by going to the Malia website: www.maliapukaokalani.com This document is the result of much work, creativity, and concern for our parish. The members of the Pastoral Council and the authors of this document are:

Samantha Naipo-Arsiga, Chairperson; Kehau Kuewa, secretary; Dennis McCartin; Moke Moses; Jeannette Lesko; Joe Farias; Billie Baclig; Natalie McKeen; Richard MacKenzie. These individuals screened all the information and the suggestions originating from the parish and from the five Standing Committees and the Inculturation Team. This means that a minimum of forty five separate parishioners were directly involved in the content of this document. This is over one fourth of our active parishioners! Congratulations and Mahalo!

The document re-affirms that a central goal of our parish is to continue the development of lay leadership. Malia has had a history of "everything changes" when one priest goes and another comes. The goal of lay leadership is that there is a continuity in the parish regardless of who is pastor. The Pastoral Plan emphasizes the importance of the Five Standing Committees (Liturgy, Faith Formation, Social Awareness, Building Maintenance, Finance) and the Inculturation Team. These committees, their chairs, and members give input, leadership, and continuity to the parish. To quote from the document, "Developing such leaders and preparing them for transition periods in the parish is a high priority for Malia Puka O Kalani".

The Pastoral Council established four goals for 2013-14 in the area of leadership. These goals originated from either the parishioners or the Pastoral Council itself:

1. To monitor, review, and update the Parish Pastoral Plan regularly. This will be done by monitoring the Standing Committees to assure that each committee is doing what they said they would do. There is also commitment to develop an updated Pastoral Plan annually.
2. To encourage and facilitate continued lay leadership for all parishioners. This is to assure that the leadership possibilities in the parish are open and inviting to ALL parishioners and not to just a few.
3. To review and evaluate the ministry for Hispanic members within the parish. The Chair of the Pastoral Council and the Pastor will meet with members of the Hispanic Community to discuss levels of integration into the parish.
4. To review, evaluate, and study the desirability for a Fund Raising Committee in the parish. The Chair of the Finance Committee and the Pastor will develop the methodology of accomplishing this evaluation.

These are the Leadership Goals. Next week we will summarize the Faith Formation Goals. Mahalo..... **Fr. Joe**
