**COMMUNAL CELEBRATION OF RECONCILIATION**

**PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 23 and 24:**

**5:15PM Saturday: Blessing and distribution of Palms**

**9:00AM Sunday: Blessing and distribution of Palms**

*both services begin outside in the patio*

**HOLY THURSDAY, MARCH 28**

**6:00PM Holy Thursday Mass, washing of the feet, followed by**

**adoration at the altar of repose and soup in the hall**

**GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 29**

**1:00PM Commemoration of the passion and death of the Lord**

**HOLY SATURDAY, MARCH 30**

**7:00PM The Celebration of the Resurrection. (This is a long ceremony, not conducive to children).**

*The ceremony begins at dusk in the patio.*

**EASTER SUNDAY MORNING, MARCH 31**

**9:00AM Easter Mass in the parish hall. The Mass will be a family Mass directed to children's participation.**

**SAFE ENVIRONMENT:** The church has taken a very strict stance regarding all clergy and all lay persons who, under the auspices of any parish, work with and/or are associating with youth (ages 0-18). A certificate of *SAFE ENVIRONMENT* is required. All of our Religious Education teachers and associates were required to obtain this certification prior to entering the classroom. We are now extending this to all adults who work with children and youth as part of parish ministry. Hence, if your music, service, formation ministry in the parish involves in associating with children/youth you are required to have a *SAFE ENVIRONMENT CERTIFICATE*. This can be obtained by going to the Diocese of Honolulu website; go to the Office of Religious Education; click “safe environment”. You will give the necessary information including your parish. There will be about a one hour lesson and quiz. At the end you will be asked to sign a form giving permission to do a background check. There is a \$10.00 and a \$25.00 fee which will be charged to the parish. At the end, you can print out your certificate. Give the certificate to either Fr. Bob or Fr. Joe. If you have any questions, please ask either priest. Most importantly, take this seriously, please.

**LIURGY COMMITTEE AND SOCIAL AWARENESS COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP:**

Both the Liturgy Committee and the Social Awareness Committee have open positions for new members. Please consider volunteering for either position. Both Committees meet only four times a year but set a very significant direction for our parish.

Two years ago, our parish listed “Lay Leadership” as one of our primary goals. This goal will continue in the new Pastoral Plan now being developed by the Pastoral Council. We have made great headway in achieving this goal with the establishment of the five standing committees, the Inculturation Team, and the Pastoral Council. Now the diocese is offering and funding a one day leadership training at the UH Hilo Campus on April 11 entitled, “How to Manage Conflict & Confrontation”. There is no cost to the individual or the parish. All who serve on any of the parish standing committees, the Inculturation Team, and the Pastoral Council are invited and encouraged to participate.
