HOLY SATURDAY, MARCH 30

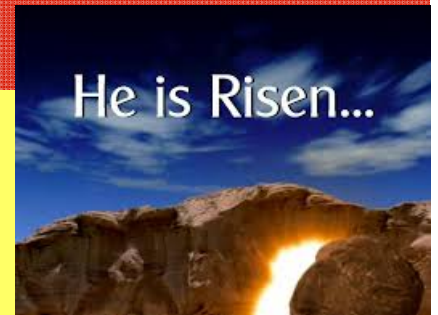
*7:00PM The Celebration of the Resurrection. (This is a long

NO RESIDENT PRIEST DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL:

There will be no resident priest at Malia during the month of April. When the bishop appointed Fr. Joe as pastor it was done with the awareness that he needs to return to the mainland at least three times a year for medical check-ups. Fr. Bob Stark offered and was appointed Parochial Vicar by the bishop with this in mind. The entire parish joins Fr. Joe in being grateful to Fr. Bob for willingly taking on this assignment in the midst of his other fulltime ministry in OSM. Fr. Bob will be here every weekend during April to celebrate the Eucharist and minister to the needs of the parish. When there is no resident pastor, it is even more important that the ordinary functioning of the parish continue through the work of the Standing Committees of the parish. If there is a matter of concern, please contact the chair of the appropriate committee. The contact numbers are on the side of the bulletin.

CHURCH OPEN/LOCKED

In the absence of a resident priest, the church building will be open only until noon each day and other times as needed/requested. For the church or other buildings to be opened other than the regular daily mornings, please make the request directly to Uncle Moke Moses no later than the Sunday before you need it opened.

SOUP FOR HOLY THURSDAY; POT LUCK FOR EASTER: You are welcome to bring soup for fellowship on Holy Thursday. If we have extra, we will refrigerate it and use it again on Easter Sunday. You are also welcome to bring food for our Easter Potluck. The big people need something to eat while the kids hunt for eggs!
