Last Sunday after Mass we had a great Ice Cream Social celebrating with the young members of our parish. This weekend after the Spanish Mass we are celebrating a fiesta with the Latinos in our parish. This weekend we will watch the Eucharist video section on *“We are Nourished as One ‘Ohana in a Sacred Meal.”* In this video section, we hear that *“we receive the Eucharist so that we can become the Eucharist”*. Let’s take some time this weekend to share some of our questions about how we are nourished in the Mass to become Eucharist.

What did the video say about the planting of *kalo* and pounding *kalo* into poi? What did you think of what Uncle Patrick said about celebrating Eucharist and how harvesting *kalo* can remind us of what it means to be *‘Ohana*? Are there other food(s) that are special for you, your family (favorite family recipes) and can these foods (or recipes our Parish Cook Book) teach us about Eucharist?

What did you think about the video saying how *“the Eucharist not only nourishes us but make us hungry for a deeper relationship with God and others”*? How does the Eucharist help us become a better person, help bring out the best in us and help us bring out the best in others? Can you give examples of this in your own life, in the life of your family, your *‘Ohana*?

As Bishop Larry says in the video, *“We believe that in the Eucharist we are fed and nourished with the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, God, the Savior of the world-this is AWESOME”!* Do you believe the Eucharist is AWESOME nourishment ---energy for your soul? How do you feel if you miss Eucharist?

We believe that the Eucharist *“changes us so that we can become more a part of Jesus alive in the world”*. How did the Eucharist nourish your faith and really transform you and your family relationships after your First Communion?

What questions have you asked your children about Eucharist? What questions have your children asked you about Holy Communion? What insights did you learn in your family from asking questions about the Eucharist? Do you ever ask questions at home after watching TV about how what you just watched may help make you a better person, a better family, a better *‘Ohana*? Hopefully our celebrating the Eucharist will always nourish us to be better persons, better families, a better parish, a better community living our faith in the world.

MALIA COOKBOOKS: The cookbook sale got off to a good start...mahalo to everyone for your support. Please continue to promote the Malia cookbook to your family, friends and acquaintances. There are wonderful and delicious recipes for every occasion and taste. In last weekend’s bulletin we announced that Fr. Joe contributed a number of Belgium recipes taught to him by his mother. Found on page 2 in the cookbook is his favorite recipe for meatballs, called Fricadellas,

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| 2 green onions with tops, minced | Pepper to taste |
| ¼ C. butter | Nutmeg to taste |
| 2 slices stale white bread | 2 lb ground pork or veal |
| 1/3 C. milk | Flour |
| 2 eggs, beaten | 2 C. light beer |
| Salt to taste | 3 Tbsp. parsley, chopped |

Saute the onion in 2 tablespoons butter until tender. Soak the bread in the milk until soft; mash with a fork. Add the onion, bread, eggs, salt, pepper and nutmeg to the meat. Blend the ingredients well and shape into 2 inch balls. Sprinkle with flour and brown in 2 tablespoons butter in large saucepan. Add the beer and cook over low heat, covered, for 20 minutes until meatballs are done through. Add the parsley just before removing from the heat. Serve with mashed potatoes and Belgian endive. Serves 6.
