Gospel – Mark 14:1-15:47 (The Passion): The Gospel of Mark has been described as a passion narrative with a long introduction. This observation throws into relief how important the final part of the Gospel is to the whole. Jesus knows beforehand what awaits Him. Throughout, He behaves as the Suffering Servant and shows Himself to be the King of the Jews despite the mocking and blindness of His opponents. The disciples, however, reach the bottom of their descent in Judas’ betrayal and Peter’s denial
